


- 2021 Cases
- Current Rate per 100,000








COVID-19 Cases by Geographic Area







Weekly Case Counts Among Coconino County Residents:






CCHHS: COVID-19 Related Deaths

Community Transmission

- Coconino County has a current incidence rate of 201.4 per 100,000, percent positivity of 9.0%^{*}, and COVID-19-Like-Illness incidence (CLI) of 3.8%^{**}.
- Coconino County is currently at a High *** level of community transmission.





Council Meeting Format



• Hybrid option: supports attendance in person or remotely

• Virtual option: attendance would be remote

Public participation would improve in both options





American Rescue Plan

- Cash or in-kind incentives for vaccination are eligible
- Motivates individuals to get vaccinated earlier
- Benefit of public health



Vaccination Incentive Examples



Louisiana

- Identified where highest number of COVID cases existed
- Set up events in that area of community at Recreation Centers
- Paid first 250 people who attended event





Ohio

- Cash incentive to address 30% decline in vaccinations
- Set up events in identified neighborhoods to address health equity gap
- Door-to-door education
- People available to answer questions or concerns
- Offered \$100 Visa gift card with first dose with verification
- •7,000 vaccinations in 5 weeks
- 55% of those who attended were "black and brown"





New York

- Began with in-kind donations in value of \$15-\$50 (e.g. tickets) provided 5% increase in vaccinations
- Contest for prizes in value of \$250-\$2,500 (e.g. memberships) increased 5% a little more
- Referral bonus program of \$100 per person to organization
 - 600 organizations participating
 - 5,000 referrals
 - 35,000 incentives remaining



Vaccination Incentive Examples



New York continued

- \$100 vaccine incentive to NY residents
 - Incentive provided with first dose
 - Verifying vaccination status in registry
 - 20,000 participants in one week
 - Gift cards provided virtually, mailed or pick up locations
 - Vaccine required to dine in restaurants

- City Council discussion on American Rescue Plan funding on September 7th
